This is your 24 day warning. Lent starts in just 24 days. Why not do something life changing this Lent? I am not saying that doing your usual thing, giving up coffee or chocolate can not be life changing but it probably isn't. It will be good for you and discipline building but maybe not that critical a turning point. To do something like that would be to do something that made a significant impact on your life but more importantly something that would make a significant impact on the lives of others.

Jesus gives us three practices which make up the heart of Lenten practice. Prayer, fasting and alms giving. The ideal would be to do something that comprised of a little of each. A friend of mine gives up meat each Lent, maybe I should because I can't imagine life without it. I was actually vegetarian for a couple of years but I can't resist roast chicken! To me roast chicken is quite normal, it is not a luxury item like coffee. But maybe I should give up meat, it would be a proper challenge. I could give the money I save to the poor. Or I could fast, like proper fasting not abstaining which I do every Lent. I usually abstain from alcohol and would like to be able to go without coffee for 40 days, I think I could live without meat more than coffee!

It sounds pathetic, Jesus went into the wilderness for 40 days so he could listen to the voice of his father with no distractions whatsoever. That is the point of our Lenten practices, to take away those things which have become barriers to us listening to God. Something life changing is listening to God more. It could be giving up all TV for 40 days and spending the hours that are then available to do some holy reading and prayer. That would have a big impact on anyone! Volunteering for an hour a week to help someone could also be life changing, it could be meaningful, it is a form of service and would draw us closer to God.

I don't know what I am I going to do yet, I am going to pray about it. I invite you to pray about what you are going to do this Lent. What does God want you to do? Ask him. Maybe this year he might like something a little more creative and inventive from you than the usual. I think it is fair to say that he does. This 24 day warning should mean that after you have reflected on what God wants you to do you can make Lent a life changing experience and not just stumble into it and fall back on the same practice you have been doing since you were 11!

Saint of the Week

3rd February SS Paul Miki & his Companions



St Francis Xavier was the first Christian apostle of Japan arriving in 1549. When he left Christians numbered perhaps 2,000. Fifty years later the Japanese ruler, incensed by their increase, embarked on a persecution. Paul Miki was Japanese, a Jesuit priest and a notable preacher. His companions included six Franciscans. The other seventeen were Japanese lay-folk and one Korean; they included a soldier, a physician, and three young boys. They were twenty-six in all and were crucified near Nagasaki.
