A Message from Fr Tom

Merry Christmas! It is officially Christmas time, well in Salisbury at least. On Thursday along with a few thousand Sarumites I gathered in the market square to witness Anthony Cotton (of course you know who he is) switching on the city's Christmas lights while 'We wish you a merry Christmas and a Happy New Year' played over the loud speakers. In Clifton, Christmas began last week. For many in our society Christmas will last from now until midnight on 25th December. It will be an intense five week rush. It feels strange being a believer in the God who created Christmas and celebrating it at a different time from the rest of society. As society winds down the festive period we as Catholics will only just be beginning it. We have a festive period based on a centuries old calendar and wider society bases its celebrations on commercial interest. The economy drives the festive period we have just entered. Our Festive period like with all of our celebrations begins with the celebration of the event and goes on for days and weeks afterwards. We usually anticipate great feasts with penitence and explode with joy when we get there.

On Thursday, Kay Burley announced on the news 'this is what \$450m looks like' and up popped an image of our Blessed Lord and Saviour, painted by Leonard da Vinci. It is a beautiful and striking representation of Jesus, under the title of Salvator Mundi- Saviour of the World. It was up for auction at Christie's and fetched well over the expected \$250m. I had an outlandish thought, what if Kay Burley had got down and prostrated herself before the large image of Jesus on the screen in front of her? I guess I was thinking of what a different world would look like, a world focussed on God not on Money. To any believing Christian it is sad to see a picture of Jesus celebrated not for the freedom he bought us but for outlandish price

paid for it. It is another sign of a world driven by economy. These are Two very different examples of a reality that consumes us. The reality that our culture and our very world view is driven by money rather than belief in God.

Yet Jesus tells us, his followers, that we are salt of the earth, light to the world and the yeast in the leaven. We are the small grains of salt to bring flavour to a world that has lost the taste of the divine. We are a small amount of Yeast that makes a huge difference to the dough. As Christians living in this world, this society do we acknowledge the great contribution we are called to make? Do we desire to make a difference to our society and its world view, or are we content with things as they are? If we are content, or if we do not wish to provoke maybe we need to search our hearts and ask what our belief in Jesus means. But hey, who would have thought of it we have a period of four weeks coming up, designed for that very purpose - Advent. Four joyful and Penitential weeks to ready our souls and search our hearts in preparation for the arrival of the Salvator Mundi, in a barren little cave, not an auction house frequented by the rich and famous of our world.
