

A Message from Fr Tom

Advent = prepare for Christmas time.

Advent does not technically mean prepare for Christmas time, the word derives from the Latin 'Ad Venire' to come. It is the season dedicated to the coming of the Lord, it is a season dedicated to his coming. This takes two forms. The first half of Advent looks at the coming of the Lord in majesty and glory at the end of time while the second half focuses our attention on the coming of Jesus at Christmas. The second half is full of prophecies from the Old Testament which speak of the coming of the Messiah, God's chosen son.

As we know, the society we live in sees this time almost as Christmas time itself. Christmas is thought of by many as the time leading up to 25th December and maybe Boxing Day too. Yet as Christians and as Catholic Christians with two millennia of traditions we recognise this time as a time of preparation for the coming of Jesus and we joyfully celebrate his arrival on Christmas Day. It would be awesome if I had as many Christmas dinners during the twelve days of Christmas as I did in the month leading up to Christmas! I don't mean because I want more Christmas dinners but that they would be more appropriate in the twelve days. With all that is going on around us it might be tempting to give in to premature Christmas celebrations, my first Christmas dinner will be on 8th Dec! We could easily make this coming month just about preparing for the family occasion and the celebration, that is a big enough job in itself. But the church provides us with this special time and calls us to make it a spiritual preparation for the coming of Jesus as a baby in the manger at Bethlehem.

So what can we do to make this a time of spiritual preparation? Here are some suggestions:

Make a good confession. There is nothing like confession to help us root out our old ways, say sorry for our sins and receive the most precious gift of God's forgiveness. This helps us start again with a spring in our step.

Reading Scripture. There are some little books at the back of church to help you read the Bible in this season. The Advent 'day by day' books are there for you, please take one and use it for a few moments each day.

Spiritual reading. You may have a book about Advent or Christmas that you like to read at this time of year. A few pages a day can be a great way to take some time out of the rush and prepare for the big day.

Come to Mass. If you come to Mass every few weeks why not come each week in the lead up to Christmas, the Sundays of Advent specially mark the countdown to Christmas with the lighting of the Advent wreath.

If you come to Mass each week why not come for some of the weekday Masses over Advent, these feature some very beautiful readings from the prophets who speak of the coming of Jesus.

Whatever you are able to do, I hope Advent will be a grace filled time for you, preparing you to celebrate with joy the birth of Christ on Christmas Day!

Saint of the Week



St Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin

1474-1548. The Virgin Mary appeared to Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin, 'talking eagle', an Aztec Indian in Guadalupe, Mexico. Juan repeatedly went to the clerics in the region and told them of his vision. On his last attempt to prove it was real, he returned to them with his cloak filled with rose blossoms, believed to be miraculous since they grew at the wrong time of the year. When he opened his cloak, not only did the roses spill out, but also imprinted on the cloth was an image of the Virgin. St Juan is an important symbol for those who have suffered persecution including slavery.

Faith Sharing: At the recent Diocesan Day, Fr Tom heard the story of a young nurse who shared how God's presence in her life made a difference to her care for a patient. The idea is that with such sharing we can strengthen one another in our faith and inspire each other. There will be a 3 minute faith sharing moment after Communion at our Masses. As guidance, the "ABC" of faith sharing is A— accurate, B— brief and C-Christ centred. Let's see if it's something that works here at St Bon's. It may have a powerful impact on our community. Helping Victims of Modern Day Slavery: Thank you to Caroline Virgo, one of our parishioners, and Melissa Blackburn from the charity unchosen and all who attended our Modern Day Slavery presentation. It was a great evening and has helped raise our awareness and given us inspiration to move forward. An opportunity has arisen to offer some support to women who have been rescued from human trafficking. We would like to invite you to buy Christmas presents (up to the value of £30) for 14 women who have been rescued and are now being processed by the system. These women are in absolute poverty and we are hoping these gifts, which could include toiletries, warm clothing etc. will help to bring a bit of joy to their Christmas. Starting School: Parents of children born between 1st September 2013 and 31st August 2014 must apply now for a school place for September 2018 onwards. Application forms are available from Bristol City Council or you can apply online. You must apply by 15th January 2018. For St Bonaventure's Primary School Catholic children you must also provide a copy of the baptism certificate to the School.

Act in support of Catholic Education: The Government is making a critical decision on whether to overturn the admissions cap which prevents new Catholic schools from allowing all Catholic pupils to attend. The Prime Minister has acknowledged that this policy discriminates against Catholics and had promised previously to abandon it. Now the Government may decide to keep this discriminatory policy in place instead of removing it. We need you to tell the Government not to discriminate against Catholics and to remove the admissions cap on new faith-based schools. Visit http://catholicnews.org.uk/education-cap to write to the Government and urge them to drop their policy which bans new Catholic schools.
