

Saint of the Week

St. Bede the Venerable

St. Bede was an English Benedictine monk at the monastery of St. Peter and its companion monastery of St. Paul. St. Bede was as well known for his scientific, historical and biblical commentaries. The majority of his writings were of this type, and covered the Old Testament and the New Testament. It was for his theological writings that he earned the title of Doctor Anglorum, and why he was declared a saint.

Historian Walter Goffart says of St. Bede that he "holds a privileged and unrivalled place among first historians of Christian Europe". His life and work have been celebrated with the annual Jarrow Lecture, held at St. Paul's Church, Jarrow, since 1958.
