


A Message from Fr Tom

Drum Roll Please.... This is the moment you have all been waiting for! Okay, that might be a bit dramatic, but I know the change of Mass times interests some of you! It has been two months since the vote closed and I am grateful to everyone who participated. About 240 of you responded and it has been really interesting analysing the data. Since the vote, I have consulted with the Parish Finance Council (PFC), the Priests of the Deanery, the Bishop and then the PFC and the Priests of the Deanery again.

The voting for Saturday evening was the easiest to read and we will be moving the Saturday evening Mass from 7.00pm to 6.00pm. The voting was clear and 6.00pm was the overall preferred choice. I am very happy with this as it means those who do not like coming out in the dark Winter months (or when Strictly Come Dancing is on!) will be able to come to Mass during the Winter. Also, it gives an option to parents with younger children to come to Mass in the evening too. This change will come into effect on Saturday 21st July.

Saint of the Week




Spotlight on St. Bonaventure: Part 1

In the lead up to the Feast Day of St. Bonaventure, we'll discover his life and work:

Born Giovanni de Fidanza in Bagnoregio, in the Lazio region of central Italy, in 1221, he received the name of Bonaventure from St. Francis of Assisi. As a child, St. Bonaventure was cured of a life threatening illness through the prayers of St. Francis of Assisi who cried out: "O Buona Ventura" which means good fortune.

At the age of 22, St. Bonaventure entered the Franciscan Order. After making his vows, he was sent to Paris to complete his studies under the celebrated doctor Alexander of Hales. He is known as the Doctor of the Church and the Patron Saint of Bowel & Intestinal Trouble.


