A Community of Missionary Disciples With Contemplative Hearts

As I write this I am at the Divine Renovation (DR) conference in Birmingham, West Bromwich, to be precise. You may have heard me talk about DR before at Mass and in the newsletter. Divine Renovation is the name given to a Parish renewal movement that was developed by Fr James Mallon and his team of Parishioners at St Benedict's Parish in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada. There are 3 core aspects to DR: 1. Everything is about evangelisation, 2. Developing Exceptional Parish leadership and 3. Relying on the Holy Spirit for Parish renewal. Fr James initially wrote a book with the title Divine Renovation, he had not expected a global movement to spring from it, the Holy Spirit does work in miraculous ways!

What drew me originally to DR was frustration. I have always had a desire for Parish renewal and for our communities to become missionary, evangelising hubs. In my early years as a Priest I thought this would come through excellent Catechesis, if people knew their faith then they would love God and then share their faith well with others. While that was well intentioned and we ran pretty amazing Catechesis, it was misguided. The Bishop of Portsmouth, Bishop Egan, often says that we Catechise people well but we do not evangelise them! He's right. If you haven't encountered God, all the learning in the world will not make up for it. Having an experience of the love of God is the essential aspect of having a relationship with him.

This experience of God's love is essential at a Parish level. It is my firm belief that Catholic Parish culture has to change, radically. Catholicism of the last century has left us with a church where many people were taught the importance of the Sunday obligation, not the love of God. This has created a church where many come and go to Mass but do not enter into a deeper and meaningful relationship with God. We have created a culture where it's about coming to Mass, not letting God touch our hearts. If belonging to a Parish is about a loving relationship with God, then we will make big sacrifices for him. If we come out of obligation we often do the bare minimum, because meeting an hour a week obligation is really the bare minimum. Would a couple in love be happy if you said 'you can only meet an hour a week?' They would tell you to get lost and let them get on with their weekends together!

DR is about forming people in Parishes, mainly through The Alpha programme, to encounter God's love through the power of the Holy Spirit. When people's hearts are touched by the Holy Spirit, they are ready to take on positions of leadership within their Parish community. This is my dream for St Bon's, that we become a community where we are alive with the love of God through the Holy Spirit, where we want to serve God in our Parish, not because we have to but because we can't help ourselves! It's my prayer that by prioritising evangelisation, leadership and an experience of the Holy Spirit our community will be transformed and the lives of many will be changed!

As we prepare to journey into the diocesan *Year of Prayer*, Fr Christopher from the Diocese's Department for Adult Education and Evangelisation shares these reflections with us.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

There is always a risk in following Jesus, in being a disciple of his. At times he can ask us to do things which almost seem foolish and incomprehensible. 'Put out into deep'. A carpenter is telling a fisherman how to fish! But risk goes hand-in-hand with a certain trust... and that's what Peter has to do; he has to learn to trust where Christ is leading him and where Christ is calling him. As we come before the Lord who calls us, forms us and gifts us to be his disciples, we are called on his terms and to be disciples as he needs us to be, so we appreciate how much in need of him we are. He calls us in spite of our weakness and our inadequacies and his choice of us might seem foolish at times... but he calls us to know him, to come close to him and then draw others to us, 'catching' them, for him. Let's pray to trust him... he knows what he is about.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Sts. Cyril & Methodius



Cyril & Methodius were brothers and often called the apostles of the Slavs. Born in Thessalonica in Greece they both became Priests. They conducted liturgical services in Slavonic and developed a special Slavonic alphabet to translate some of the Scriptures and the Liturgy.

For 5 years they worked steadily to establish Christian worship for the Moravian people. They clashed with the German missionaries, who were committed to the Latin form of Christianity. The two brothers were invited to Rome in 868 by Pope Nicholas I to explain their work. The Pope was so impressed by their success that he made them both Bishops and, contrary to expectation, authorized them to carry on their ministry in Slavic. Cyril and Methodius were great advocates in the importance of being able to celebrate liturgy in your own language.
