On Thursday my world was rocked. I was at my mum's and Tipping Point was coming to an end, I was just getting settled in for the Chase when the preview for the next show announced that it was not the Chase that would come on but a new programme called 'Cash Strapped'. Forlorn and gutted I decided to give this new programme a chance and after my first watch I cannot say I was hooked. I dare not think how long the chase has been in the background of my life but it seems that it has been there at 5pm on ITV forever, at just the time I prepare my dinner and switch from afternoon to evening. I am sure many of you have watched the Chase but for those of you who have not it was a quiz show with banal banter between the contestant and the Chaser. There was a chance for a group of people to win lots of money if everything fell into place for them. Obviously my world was not 'rocked' but it seemed strange that something that had run for years and showed no sign of ending had gone, no longer part of my 5pm, no longer part of my daily life.

Although I may not sound like it, I don't usually struggle with change, I like change but I do like familiarity and am unsettled when the familiar is taken away. There is nothing more challenging for us than the illness of a loved one or their death. When someone so familiar is taken from us it can feel like a fatal wrench. Maybe at times the loss of a loved one may come without warning and be more cruel for it but even when we are expecting it there is little that can prepare us for what we will feel. Death is the most brutal loss of the familiar in our lives and it can take us a long time to adjust, if we ever do. Death is cruel and it is important that we understand that God did not create death, he did not plan it. Death came into the world through the sin of Adam and Eve. God sent his Son Jesus to undo death and bring us eternal life, God wanted to rectify our mistake and he suffered our death to bring us his life. In a Christian sense death is a gift, it is now an invitation from God into his eternal kingdom.

On a stark level death holds a message for us, it says - 'there is something more'. Some people interpret it as saying there is nothing more but seldom have I met people who did not have some hope for the wellbeing of their loved one after death. I think most people harbour the hope that the people they love are safe in the next life, whatever their understanding of that life may be. At this time of the year the church's liturgical calendar focuses our attention on the theme of judgement. Many people feel uncomfortable with the idea that there is judgement after death, but that is how divine justice is dispensed and we know that God's justice will be laced with mercy. His mercy is not a let off or an excuse for us to not try. We have to always give the best account of our faith in how we live it. As we approach the time where we celebrate the coming of God as man let us live our faith in the knowledge and hope of the life to come. This world with all its distractions will pass away- even the Chase is not forever!



YEAR OF PRAYER

The Diocese's Department for Adult Education share these reflections.

FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

Today our Church gives a special focus to the young people of our parishes. It is National Youth Sunday and the theme for their day comes from 'Christus Vivit' The Apostolic Exhortation of Pope Francis to young people, '*For him, you have worth; you are not insignificant. You are important to him, for you are the work of his hands. That is why he is concerned about you and looks to you with affection*' (CV115). When Jesus is nailed to the Cross two criminals hanging by him, respond in different ways. One taunts him telling him to save himself if he is a king. Jesus is not interested. He is not concerned with power – he lived and died for the world because he could see the worth in every human being. To Jesus everyone is significant. The second criminal sees and understands this. He seeks mercy from the Lord, and it is immediately given. So many young people, today, do not feel that they have any worth but the more they come to know that they are loved by Jesus, the greater the possibility that their sense of worth will grow. Perhaps today we can make a commitment to building up our young people, seeing their worth and assuring them of our love, as Jesus himself offers.
